2023 OUTLOOK

In February. we launched our new corporate website (see page 2) and have begun the process of integrating social media. In March, we completed the Health City Radiology Centre, which is equipped with the latest technology facilitating advanced medical treatment locally -

a first for Cayman (see page 3).

As part of Anniversary Arch and Godfrey scholarship. celebration, plan to launch the Arch and Godfrey scholarship and hope to select the first recipient later this year.

Here are a number of other items to look forward to in 2023 - We are upgrading and automating our HR systems and will be introducing a new and comprehensive Employee Handbook. Policy modernisation of the company through digitalisation will continue, and I am pleased to note that our filing system is now fully digitalised. I would like to specifically thank Rafael B. Elias for his diligent approach to scanning and digitally coding tens of thousands of files over a

@ A&G DIGITALIZATION PROJECT

(PHASE 1) COMPLETION

Arch & Godfrey has been working with Rafael B. Elias of Elias Consulting Company and has completed an extensive 10-month digitalisation project.

THE KEY DELIVERABLES INCLUDE:

Digitising the A&G on-site physical filing system dating back three decades and implementing a streamlined, 2-year rotational on-site physical filing system in its place.

Implementing a dynamic, user-friendly digital filing system for all documentation, including fully searchable file coding encompassing a half dozen key data points – significantly improving invoicing and documentation efficiency and traceability while cutting the physical filing process in half, significantly reducing potential misfiling and payment errors, streamlining the annual audit process, and supporting the development and rollout of a firmwide plant and equipment management system.

Overseeing the development, rollout, and regular update of a new, highly adaptable corporate website to replace the dated legacy website.

Integrating a new HR system, new social media elements, and a newsletter component into the upgraded website to maximise synergies between all elements and strengthen brand value across all channels.

Coordinating the complete upgrade of the client's server to facilitate the digitalisation project and the client's continued strong growth.

We look forward to continuing to work on the equally ambitious Phase 2 of the project through the balance of 2023.

ONGOING PROJECTS

The Watermark

The Watermark spans a total of nine acres, including 300 feet of beachfront, the development comprises a three-acre site directly on Seven Mile Beach, between the Avalon and Harbour Heights, and a six-acre site on the other side of West Bay Road, with a pedestrian bridge connecting the two.

Arch and Godfrey currently has in excess of 300 workers on the site. A ten-storey tower on the beachfront will house just 54 exclusive private residences, ranging from two to five bedrooms. With large window-walls to capture the views in every residence, curved terraces

and vast open-concept living spaces and private elevators, the Watermark will raise the bar for world-class oceanfront living. At the beach level, the tower will feature a series of state-of-the-art pools, private beachfront cabanas and an elegant ocean-facing owners' conservatory, with a bar, temperature-controlled wine cellar, and a chef's kitchen.

Along with exceptional residences, the Watermark will offer an unprecedented range and quality of services and amenities. The inland site will include a fine dining restaurant, luxury spa and wellness facilities, a fitness centre and guest suites, and the development as a whole will offer a total of 12 pools (four of which will be rooftop pools), under-building parking, a private dining room, outdoor barbecue areas, a library lounge and more.

The Watermark will be unlike anything Cayman has seen before and will set a new standard for luxury living on Seven Mile Beach.

Construction of the Watermark is scheduled for completion in 2024.

ONGOING PROJECTS (CONT.)

Governor's Village

Governor's Village is a mixed-use scheme comprising a multi-unit rental property of 108-units, best in class amenities including a neighbourhood café, gym, serviced office space and laundry facilities as well as a commercial self-storage offering to support the storage needs of property owners and residents living within the surrounding neighbourhood.

The development is a 3-storey building consisting of 129k gross sq ft of residential accommodation plus 13k sq ft of outdoor amenities.

The commercial self-storage building is a 3-storey building consisting of 24.6k gross sq ft. The offering will consist of 196 units.
